Mary majored in Latin and, after graduating, taught third grade for one year. She then married her husband, Robert Crowley, whom she met at Marquette when he was in law school. Mary and Robert had four children, Robert Jr., David, Claire and Paul, whom they raised in Shorewood. Their family was active at St. Robert's Parish.

After Robert retired, he and Mary enjoyed spending their winters at their condo in Florida. In her free time, Mary enjoyed playing bridge and occasionally taking trips with her husband. After she was widowed, Mary was lucky to find love a second time, marrying a longtime friend,

Jim Ewens. Mary and Jim lived at his home on North Lake and her condo in Whitefish Bay before deciding to move to Milwaukee Catholic Home in 1994. Jim was also blessed with a long life, as he lived just short of his 102nd birthday.

At Milwaukee Catholic Home, Mary is happy to be able to attend daily mass in St. Anne's Chapel. She said that she moved to MCH because she likes the atmosphere, including all the nice people who live and work here.

Mary also enjoys visiting with her large family, including her children, 13 grandchildren, 24 great-grandchildren, and Jim's children and grandchildren. Her family joined her at Milwaukee Catholic Home for her 100th birthday celebration. For her birthday, Mary received 100 long-stem roses from her step-granddaughter, which she decided to share with her MCH friends on the altar in the chapel.

As for the secret to a long life? Mary says that she "just lived and took good care of herself." She said that she has had a happy life, and is proud to be the most senior resident of The Residence at Milwaukee Catholic Home.

NEW AEROBICS CLASS EXERCISES MINDS

Residents have been enjoying the new Mind Aerobics class offered in The Residence by our Wellness Nurse, Michele Chrisman. The group meets weekly for about an hour, with the goal of keeping their minds alert. Throughout the class, the residents discuss topics, play games, share stories, find creative resolutions to problems, and most commonly, laugh. Laughter increases the oxygen in the brain, which leads to more brain activity. Each session begins with a simple breathing exercise to relax the brain and muscles, making them ready to receive information. This exercise is followed by a poem or prose, commonly related to the humorous side of aging, and a joke for the day. Topics and activities vary from week to week, but everyone gets a chance to participate in the discussions. Occasionally, participants are asked to do "homework," consisting of games or puzzles. Other recommended Mind Aerobics activities include: reading out loud, singing, using your non-dominant hand, watching Jeopardy and Wheel of Fortune, and taking deep breaths frequently.

Keeping your mind alert is easy to do if you take the time to challenge it; make an effort to do something that makes you think or makes your hands and eyes work together. Remember, the phrase "Use it or Lose it" is not only for the body!
