FAMILY TIES

Clarence and Jean Burg's dedication to their family has been evident throughout their lives. Both were born and raised in Milwaukee; Jean grew up just four blocks from Milwaukee Catholic Home, while Clarence's family lived above and behind his father's hardware store.

After high school, Clarence studied mechanical engineering at the University of WI-Milwaukee. He joined the army a year after the attack on Pearl Harbor and was sent to Texas for training, followed by a year of college at Oregon State College. After finishing his junior year, Clarence was sent to England with the Combat Engineer Battalion, but as he says, they "never caught up with the war." They went to Germany after the Battle of the Bulge, but the war in Europe ended while they were there. They then boarded a ship for a 14,000-mile journey from the Mediterranean Sea to the Atlantic Ocean, through the Panama Canal, to Pearl Harbor and ending in Manila; the Pacific War ended before they reached the Philippines. Upon returning home, Clarence finished his college degree at the University of WI-Madison, followed by one year of graduate work at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology. He then returned to Milwaukee and joined A.O. Smith as the head of the Automotive Research Laboratory and subsequently as the Director of Information and Resource Control Systems.

During the war Jean worked at Cutler Hammer. She married and had three daughters; however, she was widowed when her daughters were only

one, three and five years old. One weekend, Jean attended a hiking club with two other widows and met Clarence. They enjoyed a day of hiking and began dating afterwards; Jean "hasn't been hiking since." Clarence and Jean got married in 1956, and one year later, Clarence adopted Jean's three young daughters. When the adoption became official, Clarence called his mother and told her, "I'm a dad!" Clarence would become a dad three more times, as he and Jean had three daughters together. They initially lived in Shorewood, before building a house that Clarence designed in Glendale. The family joined St. Nicholas Parish, where Clarence served on the Parish Council and the Archdiocesan Planning Council, and Jean volunteered and participated in Ladies of Charity. Clarence and Jean also enjoyed attending their daughters' activities and sporting events.

The Burg family traveled extensively, camping in each of the 48 contiguous states and the Canadian provinces and cruising Alaska and Hawaii. Clarence and Jean valued the family time and found each trip memorable, although one experience stands out to both of them – when their van was stolen in Montreal and they lost all of their possessions. They made the best of the situation, renting a car and driving home. Years later, they finally made it on that trip! Since retiring they have traveled on many Elderhostel trips.

Clarence and Jean lived in Glendale for 48 years, until they moved to Milwaukee Catholic Home two years ago. The Burgs are active in the community at MCH, attending daily Mass, exercise classes, softball games and other activities; they really appreciate the friendly residents and staff. They also cherish family time with their daughters, 11 grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren. For Clarence and Jean, family still comes before all else.

We say goodbye to Paul with heavy hearts, but also with an eye towards the future, as we look to build upon the foundations that Paul put in place over the past 21 years. With that perspective in mind, this truly is an exciting new phase in Milwaukee Catholic Home's 96-year tradition of service on Milwaukee's Eastside!

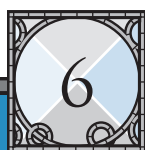

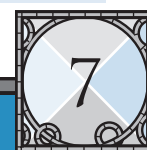

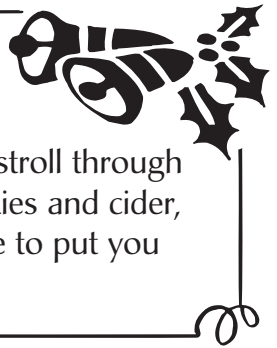
