ADELLA'S ADVENTURES

Adella Carpenter is a true self-starter who has enjoyed many unique experiences in her life – from meeting a future president to serving in the army. Adella was born and raised in Rock Island, Illinois by Belgian immigrant parents. She attended St. Paul's Catholic Church, where out of her love of music, she organized a children's choir; Adella played the organ and wrote two-part music for the choir. Several years later she started a young ladies club, and eight of the ladies still meet to this day.

After graduating from high school, Adella and two friends performed in the Peg, Polly and Pan trio. Future President Ronald Reagan even announced two of their performances! Soon afterwards, Adella got a job at a bakery and eventually became the store manager. During that time she took math classes at Augustana College and later started working as an accountant.

A year later, patriotism led Adella to join the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps (WAAC). She reported to training camp in Des Moines, Iowa, where she was a part of the first company of WAAC and lived in horse stables. Adella was assigned to the bakers and cooks post, which was in charge of feeding 200 officers each day. While in training, she met her future husband, Melvin, who was an instructor in the bakers and cooks school. Two weeks after Melvin and Adella met, they were engaged, and two months later, they were married!

After serving in the Army, Adella and Melvin settled in Rock Island and had two daughters. Melvin was a carpenter and renovated a 100-year-old house for their family to live in. Adella

worked at Servus Rubber Company, starting in the shipping room and working her way up to become cashier of the company.

When Adella and Melvin retired, they bought a large acreage in Pilot Mound, Iowa, and Melvin worked with a contractor to finish building their new house. Adella enjoyed canning the fruit from their apple trees and fishing from their boat on the river and pontoon on the lake. She and Melvin would share what they caught, hosting fish fries for their neighbors in Pilot Mound.

Adella and Melvin were also active in the American Legion; he was elected President of the American Legion, while she served as President of the Auxiliary. In addition to her love of music and fishing, Adella enjoyed crocheting afghans.

Fifteen years later, Adella moved to Davenport, Iowa to be near her sisters. She and her sisters enjoyed traveling to exotic locales such as Fiji, Australia and New Zealand. During one of their trips, Adella got more than she bargained for when she accidentally got on the wrong boat and ended up whitewater rafting – at 85 years old!

Several years ago, Adella moved to Milwaukee Catholic Home to be close to her daughter, grandchildren and great-grandchild. Adella likes living in Milwaukee and loves being able to see her family so often. She enjoys serving on the Welcome Committee at MCH, where she helps new residents feel at home. After all she has done, we're so glad that she made MCH her home.

FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR

We have recently been busy preparing for our re-accreditation with CARF – CCAC. Since our first accreditation in 2002, the Continuing Care Accreditation Commission was acquired by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities. It is the nation’s only accrediting body for continuing care retirement communities (CCRCs) and is widely regarded as the mark of quality for aging services. Milwaukee Catholic Home is one of only five CCRCs in Wisconsin that are currently accredited by CARF-CCAC; our accredited status indicates to our residents, families and the community that Milwaukee Catholic Home is a leader in providing quality long-term care services.

The accrediting process provides a clear way of determining whether a retirement community is financially stable and providing quality care, two things Milwaukee Catholic Home prides itself in as an organization. To be accredited, organizations must demonstrate ongoing innovation and continued compliance to standards. Milwaukee Catholic Home must be committed to continuous quality improvement in governance and administrative areas, financial practices, and the care and services we provide to our older adults.

In the next few months we will be thinking about the work we do and measuring our performance in four critical areas: determination of satisfaction through input from stakeholders; access to services; effectiveness of services; and efficiency of services.

A team of CARF – CCAC surveyors will be performing an onsite evaluation in June. They anticipate a three-day visit, during which each department will be evaluated. The survey team begins their evaluation with a tour and orientation to Milwaukee Catholic Home. They will make many observations, review documentation, and interview residents, families, staff, board members and corporate stakeholders.

After spending time on our campus, the team will prepare a plan for Milwaukee Catholic Home. They will send the plan to Washington, DC for review and to ensure there has been an accurate interpretation of standards. We will receive an official report and summary letter in approximately 6 – 10 weeks. The accreditation board grants reaccreditation for a five-year span. We are proud to be a part of this elite group of quality retirement communities.
